

INTRODUCTION

Immortalized by the likes of Kipling, Masters and Orwell, the mystical land of Myanmar, (formally known as Burma) offers the traveller and photographer a kaleidoscope of colours and culture that will remain with you for a lifetime.

Join us as we explore and photograph perhaps the least discovered country in Southeast Asia. Until recently closed to western tourism, Myanmar stands as one of the world's newest destinations. Myanmar is known as the Golden Land not only for its glittering Buddhist monuments and rich cultural heritage, but also for the phenomenal natural beauty found in its forests, rivers, green valleys and seacoast. However, it is the inhabitants that give Myanmar its characteristic charm. They have often been described as the most friendly, open-hearted people in the world.

Our itinerary includes Yangon's Schwedagon Pagoda which dominates the urban skyline, the ancient city of Bagan where thousands of gilded temple spires fill the valley, Inle Lake, where we will photograph local fishermen, bustling local markets and lakeside life seemingly unchanged for centuries. In Mandalay we will photograph monks crossing U Bein bridge, the longest teak bridge in the world.

Each location provides a wide variety of opportunities including early morning hill-tribe markets, street photography, fabulous landscapes, portraits and still life.

Burma, is a country of incredible diversity and our journey will be full of "authentic" travel experiences.

Day 01 Depart UK

Day 02 Arrive Yangon

Arrive Yangon Airport (formerly known as Rangoon), once the capital of Myanmar. This city is also called "Garden City of the East" because of its many parks and beautiful lakes. On arrival met at Yangon International airport and transferred to our hotel.



The afternoon is free to relax or begin your explorations of this amazing city. Late afternoon meet other group members and and enjoy dinner together. Overnight hotel (D)

Day 03 Yangon sightseeing

We will visit the Shwedagon Pagoda. This is one of the most spectacular religious monuments of the world. The world famous stupa is 98 meters high and covered in gold. We will also visit the 70 meters long Reclining Buddha Chaukhtatkyi, a photo stop at the Kandawgyi Royal Lake, the Bogyoke Aung San (Scott) Market (closed on Monday and public holidays), the Botataung Pagoda, the two thousand year old Sule Pagoda, China Town and a fruit market. We will return to the Shwedagon Pagoda for sunset photography.



market. We will return to the Shwedagon Pagoda for sunset photography. A spectacular work of Burmese temple architecture, glowing in gold and adorned with diamonds, this is the holiest Buddhist shrine in Myanmar. Overnight hotel (BLD)

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Day 04 Yangon - Bagan

Morning transfer to the airport for the flight to Bagan. Our sightseeing and photography of one of Asia's most popular archeological destinations starts with busy Nyaung Oo Market. In the afternoon we visit Htilomindo Temple, Ananda Temple, Memalaungkyaung Temple, with our final destination being Shwesandaw Pagoda where we photograph the vast pagoda-filled horizon at sunset. Bagan is one of the most significant ancient religious cities in



Southeast Asia, fantastic temple ruins, making this one of the most amazing sights in Myanmar and a real wonder of the world. Overnight hotel (BLD)

Day 05 Bagan – Popa - Bagan

This morning we are up early and get into our horse drawn carriages for sunrise photography at the temples. After breakfast we have a day tour, through rural villages to Mt. Popa, a place of pilgrimage for Burmese of all walks of life. The mountain is an extinct volcano and according to legend, is the home of the 'Nats', or spirits. Close to the mountain is a village where we can see and photograph the palm sugar and oil cottage industries, which are in operation. Return to Bagan for sunset photography at Phat That Gyi Temple. Overnight hotel (BLD)



Day 06 Bagan sightseeing

Another early start for sunrise photography, this time at Minyangone or Shwesandaw Pagoda, depending upon lighting conditions. We return to our hotel for breakfast and then enjoy a guided tour of Bagan which will provide many photography opportunities. We will visit a lacquer workshop, Kyaukpataung City market, Chauk City Market and Minnanthu village. For those who wish we will return to Bagan temples for more sunset photography. Overnight hotel (BLD)



Day 07 Bagan – Mandalay

Fly to Mandalay, the economic centre of Burma and the country's 19th century capital. In the afternoon we visit Mandalay Hill and the City Palace. We will visit the Kuthodaw Pagoda at the foot of Mandalay Hill to see the world's largest 'book' (an entire Buddhist canon recorded on 729 stone tablets!). Mandalay hill is known for its abundance of pagodas and monasteries, and has been a major pilgrimage site for Burmese Buddhists for nearly two centuries. In the evening there is a night market to explore and photograph. Overnight hotel (BLD)



Day 08 Amarapura – Inwa – Sagaing

Today we travel to Amarapura, the City of Immortals, was a capital before Mandalay was built. In Amarapura we visit and photograph the Mahagandayone monastery, to observe the morning meal of hundreds of monks. We then go to Sagaing, a religious sanctuary with the town at the foot of the hills and hundreds of pagodas, monasteries and nunneries tucked into



the surrounding valleys and hills. It's a photographer's paradise. The famous Sagaing Hill provides breath-taking views across the entire region and the clusters of pagodas that dot the surrounding hills. Sagaing, is a popular retreat for Buddhist devotees and the area is also famous for its silverware workshops. Overnight hotel (BLD)

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Day 09 Mingun & Sunset at U Bein Bridge

After breakfast we transfer across the city to Mandalay port where we will board our private boat for our 45 minute cruise along the Ayeyarwady River as far as the 18th century royal capital of Mingun, home to the world's largest ringing bell, weighing in at 87 tons. Mingun is also home to the unfinished Mingun Pagoda, which was built between 1790 and 1797 by King



Bodawpaya. We return to Mandalay. Later in the afternoon we visit and photograph monks at sunset, crossing the U Bein Bridge, the world's longest teak bridge. Overnight hotel (BLD)

Day 10 Mandalay - Heho - Pindaya - Kalaw

Fly to Heho. Arrival at Heho airport and drive to Pindaya which is noted for its extensive limestone caves filled with Buddha images. It's a picturesque drive, passing through the PaO and Danu villages of Pwehla and Ji Chanzi and endless fields of dry cultivated mountain rice and potato. Along the way you will pass many farmers bringing their crops to the roadside by ox-cart, for collection by wholesalers from as far afield as Yangon or China.



Inside the Pindaya Caves are nearly 8,000 Buddha images that have been placed there over the centuries. Made of various materials and of different sizes, the statues are situated in every nook and cranny throughout the many cave chambers. We then continue our drive to Kalaw. Overnight hotel (BLD)

Day 11 Kalaw – Inle Lake

After breakfast we visit and photograph Kalaw market and then drive to Nyaung Shwe. Guided walking tour of Nyaung Shwe town including the many monasteries, pagodas and the local market before boarding a small boat and setting out onto Inle Lake. The narrow channels widen as we approach the lake proper, and you'll soon be crossing the broad and (usually) tranquil waters, with hills and mountains in every direction, the panorama is simply breathtaking. Overnight hotel (BLD)



Day 12 Inle Lake sightseeing

After breakfast we board our private boats to visit and photograph different lakeside markets where the hill tribes come to buy, sell and exchange all types of goods, including fish, produce, farm implements and handicrafts. The region is home to at least eight different tribes, who live both on and beside the lake. We will photograph the floating markets, floating vegetable gardens and visit several minority villages, including Inpawkhone, a floating village famed for it's weaving. There will be time to visit the Phaung Daw Oo Pagoda, with its famous five golden statues and the old teak Ngaphechaung monastery. Overnight hotel (BLD)

Day 13 Indain sightseeing

Morning visit to the 5 days market (if today coincides with Inle market day) and continue our Inle Lake photography with a visit to Indain and its enchanting 17th century pagodas. To reach Indain and the nearby village we will take our boat up a small scenic creek that runs into Inle lake. We will visit and photograph the silk and lotus weaving industry, cheroot making and Shan traditional papermaking. If we are lucky we have a chance to see the "Padaung" (long neck) women who wear neck rings to stretch their necks. Overnight hotel (BLD)



Day 14 Heho – Yangon

After breakfast, transfer to Heho airport for the flight to Yangon. On arrival transfer to our hotel. Afternoon is free to relax, explore, shop and possibly one last visit to Shwedagon Pagoda for sunset. Overnight hotel (BLD)

Day 15 Departure transfer

Transfer to airport for your departure flight. (B)

The day-to-day schedule should be taken only as a general guide. A variety of factors, including adverse weather conditions, difficulty with transportation and politics can lead to enforced changes. Because of this it is not possible to guarantee that any of our holidays will run exactly according to the planned itinerary. The trip leader will make any changes, which are necessary.

B = breakfast, L = lunch, D = dinner

INTERNATIONAL FLIGHTS

If you would like Classic Journeys to book your international flights (UK clients), please tick the flight inclusive package box on the booking form. Please advise if you have a preferred airline you would like to travel with or if you have a preferred airport you would like to travel from. Classic Journeys will then book your international flights and advise you of the actual cost. To discuss your international flight options, please give the Classic Journeys office a call and we will advise on up to date flight prices and timings for your chosen trip.

Baggage Allowance: For hold luggage this is normally around 20kg and you should aim to keep to the airlines weight allowance. For internal flights the limit may be 15kg. Classic Journeys is not responsible for any excess baggage charges incurred.

Land Only Clients: Land only clients who are making their own flight arrangements should meet up with the group at the hotel in Yangon. We can arrange airport transfers if needed and will provide hotel contact details. If you have booked on a land only basis and are making your own flight arrangements, you must check with the Classic Journeys office that your chosen holiday has reached the minimum numbers required and is **guaranteed to operate** before paying for your air tickets. We cannot be held liable, in cases where we cancel your trip, for losses incurred relating to any flight booking you have made.

PRICING

If you choose the Land Only plus international flights package Classic Journeys will book your international flight and advise you of the cost. The price of the tour will be the Land Price plus the cost of international flights on your chosen airline. With most airlines, flights have to be paid for on making the flight booking and we will require full payment for the air tickets in order to purchase the tickets. In this situation we advise paying for your air tickets as soon as possible to secure the lowest fare. Airfares and taxes are subject to change and if the fare has increased before the final balance has been paid, the additional cost will be passed on and detailed on the invoice.

IMPORTANT NOTES

Myanmar is going through major changes at an elevated pace. We reserves the right to make any necessary amendments. We may need to look at alternative options to our preferred hotels, flight times and review costing accordingly. Many of the hotels now require up to a 50% deposit to guarantee bookings. We will inform you of the deposit requirement amount upon confirming your booking. Dealing with many of the local hotels, airlines and transportation suppliers in Myanmar has become rather unpredictable. Contracts are often recalled or even cancelled and sudden increases applied without prior notice. These types of events are beyond our company control. We do our best to honour quoted rates and always try to negotiate the best possible terms with our suppliers.

DEPOSITS

Due to high demand and small number of rooms many of the hotels in Myanmar require up to 50% non-refundable deposit to guarantee reservations. We will advise the required amount on a case by case basis to guarantee the booking.

PASSPORT & VISA REQUIREMENTS

You will require a passport valid for at least 6 months from the date of entry into Myanmar All travellers require an entry visa to Myanmar valid for the duration of their stay prior to their arrival and carry a passport which is valid for at least 6 months from the date of arrival in Myanmar. Passports should have at least 2 blank pages on arrival to Myanmar. We can obtain Visa on Arrival (VOA) permits for our group members for the full duration of your visit to the country.

GROUP SIZE

This trip is definitely operating as Ann will be meeting John and Angela Walton in Bangkok (on their way from New Zealand) to fly to Yangon on the 17th March to commence this itinerary. This will be our first venture into Myanmar and promises to be an exciting adventure. There will be a strong emphasis on photography as Myanmar is one of THE best destinations for travel photography.

TOUR GRADE

EASY CULTURAL TOURING: Most of this tour involves overland travel in comfortable vehicles. Some of the roads are poorly maintained and sections will have potholes. Be prepared for some early mornings.

HEALTH & FITNESS REQUIREMENTS

The pace is considered easy and should enable anyone in good health to participate. While there are no specific physical requirements, it is important that travellers are in good health, have a positive attitude, a sense of humour and a spirit of adventure. Tours can consist of early starts, some long days or climbing into vehicles. Be prepared for some lengthy journeys, bumpy dirt roads or the occasional delay. The amount of walking involved in this trip varies.

Most of the sightseeing and exploring the cities will be on foot in order to take photographs. We carry a basic first aid kit but recommend that each person carry their own personal first aid kit including any prescription medication they require; a suggested contents list will be provided on booking in the country information dossier. We also provide details of the recommended vaccinations needed.

SINGLE SUPPLEMENTS

If you are a single person booking this holiday you do not have to pay single supplements, if you are happy to share. If you are travelling by yourself you will be paired with another single client of the same gender. However your booking is accepted only on the understanding that if no roommate is available then you accept a single supplement will be levied. Single supplements are payable if you specifically request to have a room to yourself. If you have requested single accommodation we will do our best to secure this although this may not always be possible.

WEATHER

It doesn't get any better than March; arguably the best time of the year to travel in Burma. With no rain expected throughout the month and the chilly winter feel in the highlands now a distant memory; you can expect excellent weather across the country.

INSURANCE

It is a condition of booking with Classic Journeys that you have adequate travel insurance cover. It is very important that you obtain insurance cover against the usual risks associated with adventure travel, from the date of booking until the date you return home. Please ensure that your insurer is aware of your Classic Journeys itinerary and agrees to cover the activities being undertaken. Please ensure that your insurance provides adequate protection against the two major concerns: medical / repatriation expenses while abroad and cancellation / curtailment charges in the event that you, a travelling companion or a close relative fall ill either before or during the trip. For trekking holidays your travel insurance must contain evidence of satisfactory cover for repatriation and helicopter rescue.
